

Ali Hasanov: Reports of HRW and Freedom House Are Not Objective

BAKU. January 15, 2009: Annual reports of Human Rights Watch and Freedom House about human rights and freedoms in Azerbaijan do not reflect "objective reality," Ali Hasanov, head of social-political department of presidential administration, told Turan news agency.

"We were especially upset by Freedom House assessment of separatist regimes in the South Caucasus," said Hasanov.

He added that Azerbaijan was an independent country and that its foreign and domestic policy was based "on the will of people."

"Azerbaijan's policy is not based on desires of other countries. We understand that these organizations are connected with certain centers, which would like Azerbaijan to meet their interests. Interests of international standards stand below our national interests and the interests of the people. In this aspect we understand their intentions," Hasanov said (Turan).
